

Articles of Peace and Amity concluded
 upon by the Hon^{ble} Charles Calvert Esq^r Governour
 of the Province of Maryland on the behalf
 of the Right Hon^{ble} the Lord Proprietary of
 the said Province of the One Party
 And Wastanawoc Harigwasa & Goroowag =
 Serachema were Captains of the Sasquahana =
 =noughs Nation this 29th Day June 1668
 of the Other Party

Comprimis

That the Sasquahana Renoughs Indians shall deliver
 Wastanawoc that killed the English man at
 the mill if ever he returned out of Captivity
 from the Cinagoes, And for the future that
 they shall apprehend Indians and deliver up
 to the Governour of this Province for the time
 being any Indian whatsoever that shall kill
 any English man And that as soon as they
 shall come to know of it And so it will be
 their power to apprehend And that without
 demand made by the English -

That every Indian that shall hereafter kill any hoggs
 or Cattle of the English and shall thereof be
 Committed shall pay for every hogg fifty fathom
 of Beaks and for every head of any other
 sort of Cattle one hundred fathom of Beaks
 for Satisfaction to the Owners of every
 such Beast -

3^d by

That all former Crimes Committed by any Indian
 of that Nation shall be forgot & buried in
 Oblivion except Murder of any English
 not yet discovered

4 July

That the King of Potomack his two Sons & by
 some of the Sasquahanough Indians delivered
 up Prisoners to Major Samuel Galesmyth to the
 Commission spee'd on witness whereof the said
 Coastahanda Hariguora and Goswonguachqua
 have sett to their hands this 29th Day of
 June Ann. 1666

Further ordered that the Provinciall Court
 County Court of S Marys County be held
 together at S Marys 5 times in 3 years
 for the future and not else where (next)

The first Court to be held at S Marys on the 12th of
 Tuesday in the month of October, the second Court
