 absented were excused by the Governor
 The Committee brought in the charge of the first present Assembly which is as followeth viz:
 At the Committee for Charge of the Assembly. The Committee appointed for
 consideration to be made to the parties underwritten. The 21st of April 1649.

The Bill of charges being read it was ordered to be read at following viz:
 It is ordered by the authority of the first present Assembly that the Governor shall
 give unto the Sheriff of St Maries County to summon two Jurors
 out of every Hundred to be chosen by the Hundred to make the next
 June and a list to be presented by the Governor in October next
 and make Affidavit on all the Jurors of one Hundred of the charge
 that shall be returned the next year. This order for the Liberty is possible by all
 but Mr Brown.
 A Letter was read to be sent to the next Session and signed by the
 whole House present.

The Governor Dissolved the Court.

At the next Session of the Assembly appointed unto the next and made
 at a general Session of the said Assembly holden at St Maries on the
 one and twentieth day of April Anno Domini 1649 as followeth viz:

An Act concerning Religion

Whereas in a well governed and christian Commonwealth matters concerning Religion
 and the honor of God ought in the first place to be taken into serious consideration
 and provided to be satisfied as it therefore ordered and enacted by the right
 honorable Lord Baron of Balthamore absolute Lord and Proprietary of the
 Province with the advice and consent of the Court of Council and Assembly that the

 August 1650.
